

# French Numbers 1-100 (A1-4)

Count, say prices, tell your age, and read phone numbers in French.

Combien ça coûte ?	kohn-byan sah KOOT	How much is it?

## At the cafe - a mini conversation

- Vous:** **Bonjour ! Un café, s'il vous plaît.** Hello! One coffee, please.  
**Serveur:** **Bien sûr. Ça fait deux euros cinquante.** Of course. That's 2 euros 50.  
**Vous:** **Voici. Bonne journée !** Here you go. Have a good day!

## Quick tips

- From 21 to 69, say the ten plus the digit: trente-cinq (35). Only 'one' adds et: vingt et un (21).
- 70 to 99 is French math: 70 = soixante-dix (60+10), 80 = quatre-vingts (4 x 20), 90 = quatre-vingt-dix.
- quatre-vingts keeps its final s only at exactly 80; it drops when another number follows (quatre-vingt-deux).
- Read phone numbers in pairs: 06 42 17 = zero-six, quarante-deux, dix-sept. Silent endings return before vowels (dix ans = dee-ZAHN).

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
